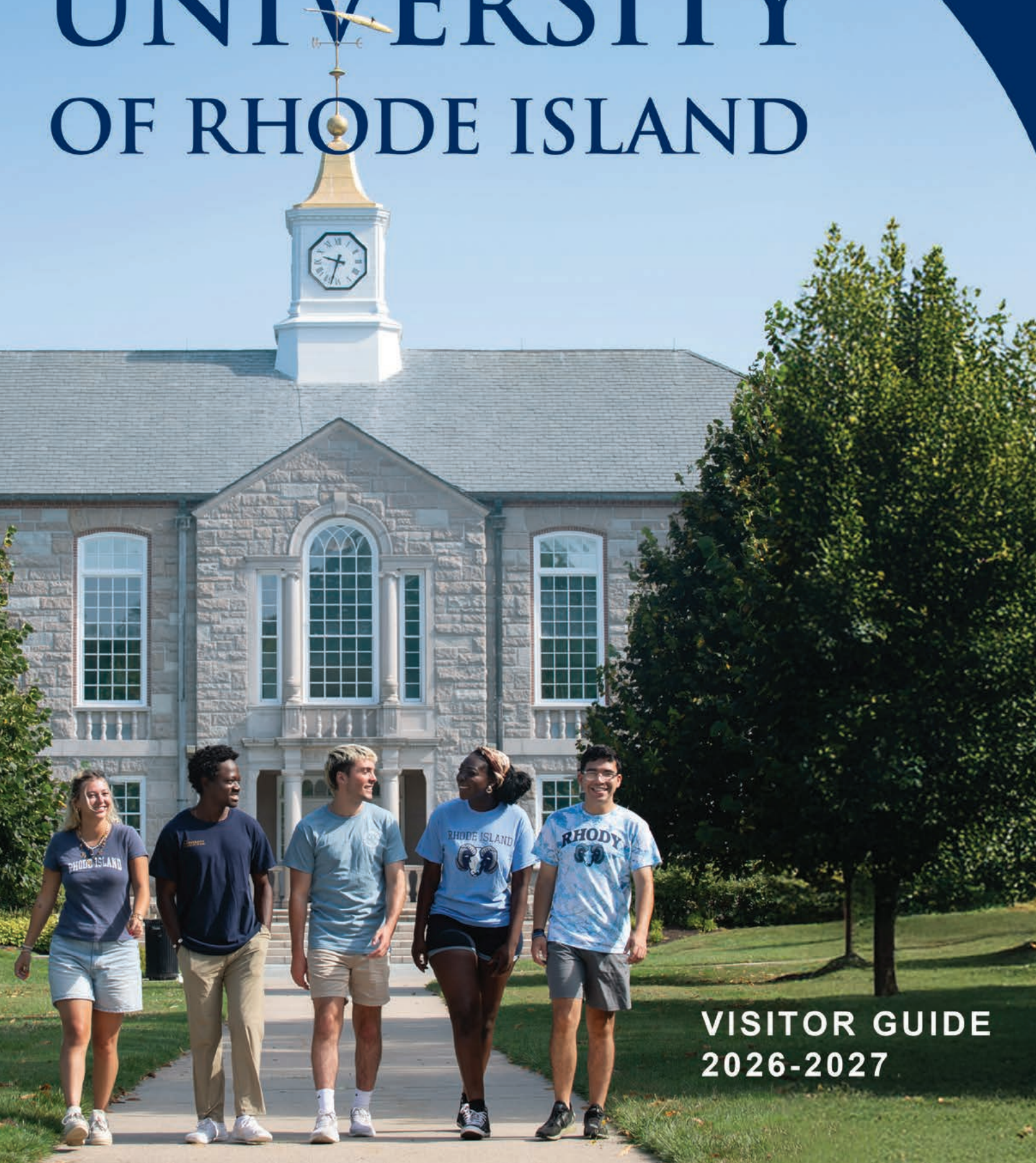

A Day in the Life

Want to know what it's really like to be a URI student? Have a look at a student timeline for a typical day in the life of a Rhody Ram.



Skyler Theater/Business; Simsbury, CT

7:30 a.m. Wake up and make breakfast. Since I live off campus, I'm able to make all my own meals. I typically have eggs and avocado with bacon.

8 a.m. Drive to the gym. I love getting in an early morning workout.

9 a.m. Shower, then walk to my Macro Economics class.

10:50 a.m. Walk to my Managerial Accounting class.

11:50 a.m. Walk to Acting. This class is usually held in the Will Theatre, where we work on new skills and share our monologues, etc. We're always on our feet and moving. I try to get there early and stay a little afterwards to chat. The theater community is so small, it's easy to make friends.

1:50 p.m. Eat lunch and take a little break, since the day can be very taxing sometimes. I usually also have time to call my parents and check in with them.

3 p.m. Homework time! Usually I finish it all; if not, I have to squeeze it in later.

4:30 p.m. Head to the theater to rehearse the current play I'm in. Rehearsals usually last anywhere from 4–5 hours at night and are another time to get some homework done (if I'm not doing much in rehearsal). For the show *Guys and Dolls*, I was the dance captain, so I spent a lot of time reviewing dance numbers with everyone and learning new choreography.

10 p.m. Head back home for the night. I also take this time to chat with my housemates and catch up with them before heading to bed at around 11 p.m.



Emma Psychology; North Kingstown, RI

8 a.m. Wake up and get ready for the day.

8:45 a.m. Leave my room in Aldrich Hall and walk to URI Emergency Medical Services (EMS) headquarters for my shift. Our team is made up of first responders, ambulance drivers, and nationally registered EMTs. On the way in, I grab breakfast at Brookside Bistro (usually an iced vanilla chai and a cinnamon roll, or an egg and cheese sandwich — these are THE BEST).

12 p.m. Walk to Beapre Center for Chemical and Forensic Sciences for my General Chemistry II class.

1:45 p.m. Walk over to the Center for Biotechnology and Life Sciences (CBLs) for Health Psychology.

3:15 p.m. Walk to Mainfare Dining Hall for a late lunch. I usually have a salad from the salad bar.

3:45 p.m. Head back to my room, change, and walk down to Tootell Aquatic Center.

4 p.m. Hop in the water for swim practice. I'm a member of the URI Club Swimming and Diving team, which is similar to varsity sports in high school. It involves a fair level of commitment—there's practice five days a week, and we travel within New England (and sometimes further for bigger meets), but it doesn't involve as much commitment as a DI sport.

5:30 p.m. Finish practice, shower, change, and walk up to Butterfield Dining Hall.

6 p.m. Eat dinner with some friends and teammates. Our dining halls offer a rotating homestyle menu, so I'll usually grab whatever is being served there. I'll also sometimes have a slice of house-made pizza.

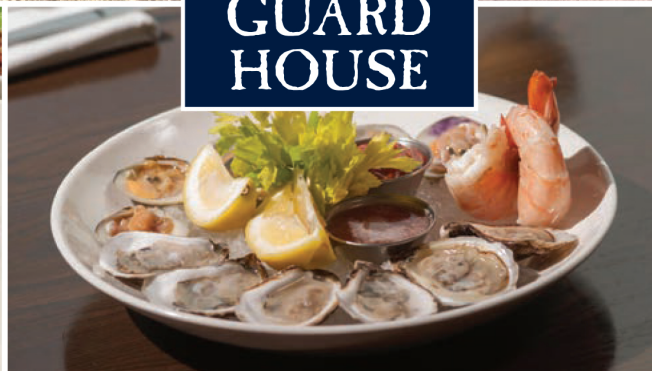
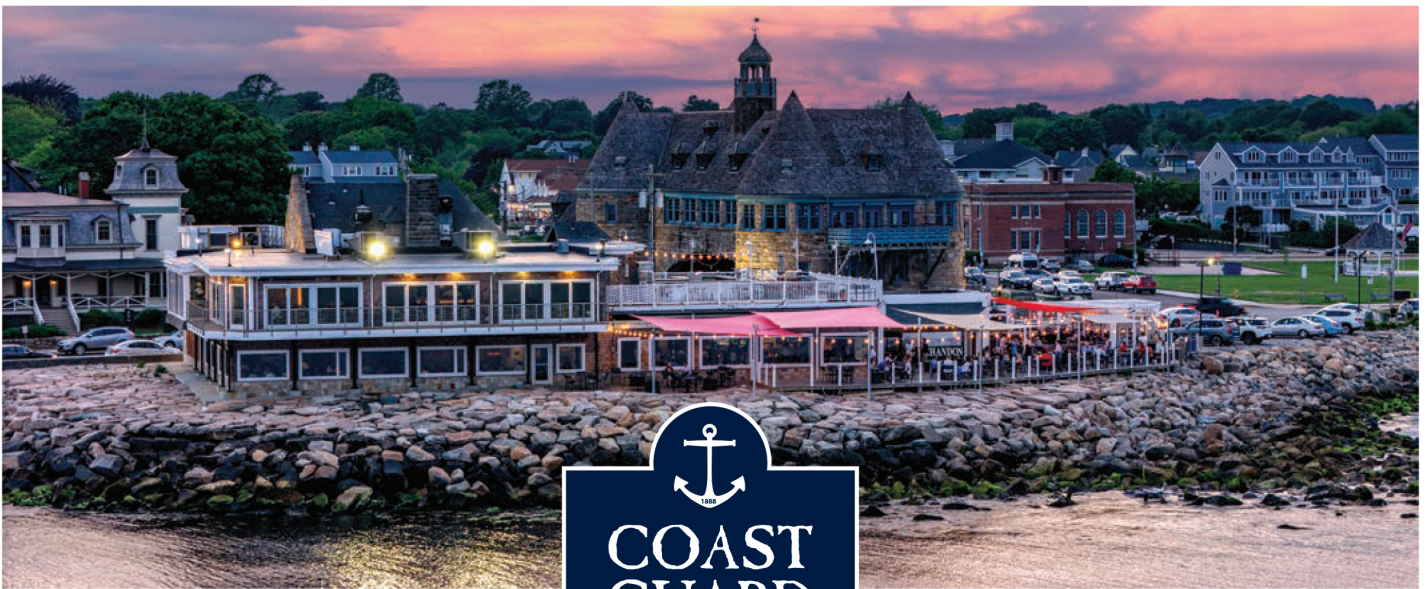
7 p.m. Head back to my room and answer emails as well as work on some training for my job as a research assistant.

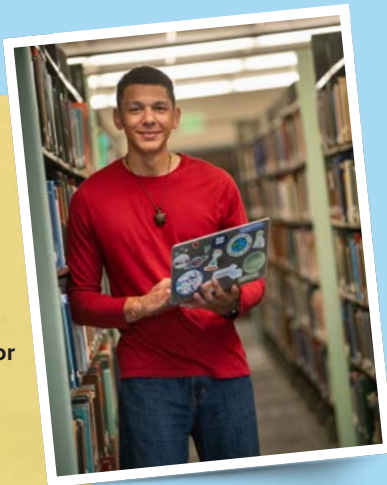

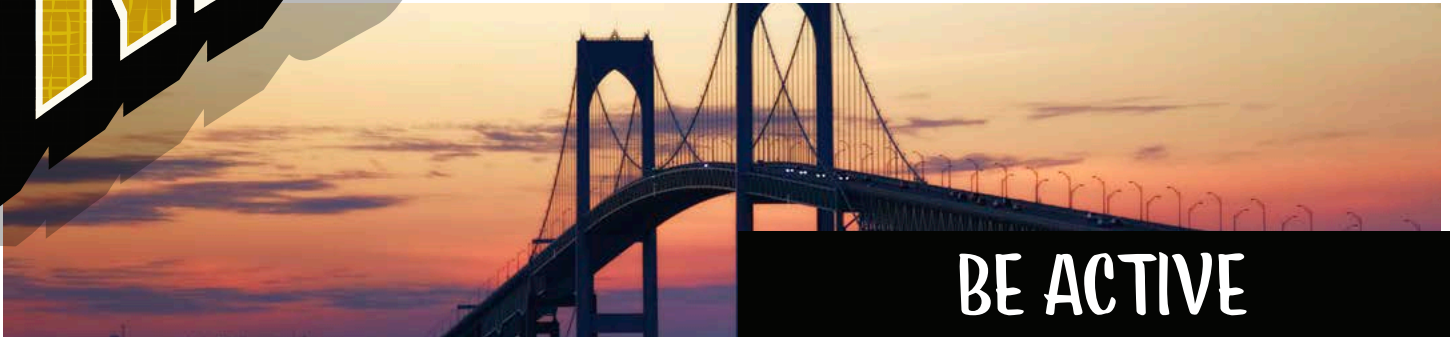

BE ACTIVE

Savor the views along the Newport Cliff Walk

Spend some time walking along the eastern shore of Newport on this National Recreation Trail, with stunning panoramic views of the ocean on one side, and Gilded Age mansions on the other. You can walk a short segment or the entire 3.5 miles. There are many entrances, but a great place to begin is at the western end of Easton's Beach.

Visit Roger Williams Park Zoo

Located amid 40 acres of beautiful woodlands, the RWP Zoo is home to more than 160 species of animals including a Komodo dragon, red pandas, snow leopards, penguins, and more! For something slightly out of the ordinary, take an exhilarating zip ride or a train excursion through the park.

1000 Elmwood Avenue, Providence

Discover Waterplace Park

This four-acre park and scenic riverwalk in Providence's downtown area features many local attractions and events such as Waterfire, outdoor music festivals, kayak tours, and river cruises.

Memorial Boulevard, Providence

Walk or bike the William C. O'Neill Bike Path

This popular, 7.8 mile, scenic, paved bike path is also called the South County Bike Trail (rail trail). It runs from Amtrak's Kingston Station parking lot to Narragansett (about a mile from Narragansett Pier).

1 Railroad Avenue, West Kingston

Experience beautiful Block Island

This scenic island about 12 miles off our coast is a popular day trip or overnight destination. Enjoy biking, hiking, boating, swimming, sampling local seafood, and scenic views. While there is a small airport, most visitors take the ferry from Point Judith or Newport.

Don't miss Beavertail Lighthouse and Park

On your drive to Newport, make a pit stop in Jamestown to see Beavertail Lighthouse and Park. It's the perfect place to take in breathtaking views of the ocean, explore Rhode Island's first lighthouse, and have a picnic lunch.

Visit South County Commons

Convenient to campus, the Commons Shopping Center features diverse restaurants and retailers as well as a hotel, apartments, eight-screen cinema, and fitness center. There are also service providers, medical practices, law firms, financial services, and professional offices.

Discover Wickford Village

A picture-perfect village in the town of North Kingstown, Wickford is a 15-minute drive from campus and features one of the largest collections of 18th century homes in the Northeast. Walk along the harbor, through the charming neighborhood, and visit the many eclectic shops, galleries, and restaurants.

Don't miss Thames Street in Newport

Take a stroll along Newport's 1.5-mile historic thoroughfare where you'll find museums, galleries, unique local shops, picturesque marinas, incredible food, and lively nightlife. If you can, schedule some time to explore Ocean Drive by car, too. This 10-mile route is filled with breathtaking coastal views and historic landmarks.

Thames Street, Newport

Explore College Hill

This student hotspot on Providence's East Side is home to the Brown University Bookstore, an arthouse movie theater (The Avon), and numerous shops, coffee houses, and diverse restaurants. It's also a short walk to Wickenden Street in the Fox Point neighborhood and nearby India Point Park, the Providence Pedestrian Bridge, an impressive sunflower field art installation, and Plant City, a popular vegan restaurant.

One of the oldest indigenous museums in the country, Tomaquag showcases the history, culture, and arts of native peoples in New England, including the Narragansett, Niantic, Pokanoket, Wampanoag and Nipmuck.

Spend an afternoon at the RISD Museum

A major cultural institution, the RISD Museum houses approximately 100,000 works of fine and decorative art ranging from ancient times to the present.

Explore Slater Mill

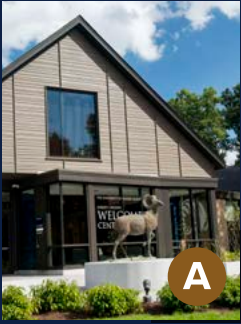

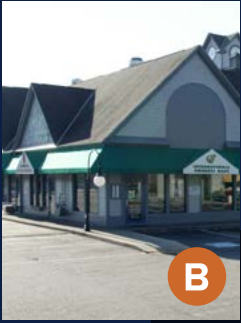
Discover the Gilbert Stuart Museum

Awful Awful

Newport Creamery began in 1928 as a wholesale dairy and now serves ice cream and diner food. Its signature drink, the Awful Awful, is a shake made with syrup and ice milk — "awful big, and awful good!" Experience it yourself at Newport Creamery, 7679 Post Road, North Kingstown, 02852.

Pizza Strips

Who knew that pizza dough topped with only a thick layer of seasoned red sauce could be so good? This unique local favorite is eaten cold and makes the perfect picnic (or anytime) snack! Grab one at Colvitto's Pizza & Bakery, 91 Point Judith Road, Narragansett, 02882.

Coffee Milk

Mouyos is also a NOAA Hollings Scholarship recipient. This prestigious award for undergraduates in marine sciences is designed to increase undergraduate training in oceanic and atmospheric science, foster public support of stewardship of the ocean and atmosphere, and recruit and prepare students for public service at NOAA and other natural resource agencies. They award 100 of these \$19,000 undergraduate scholarships total per year, and URI has been consistently represented by students like Mouyos.

“This is an exciting opportunity to collaborate with other students and work alongside experienced NOAA professionals and scientists,” Mouyos said. “I am looking forward to the immersive experience working at a NOAA facility and the valuable skills I will learn along the way.”

R.J. Fatorma '26 is also no stranger to big thinking. While tackling a double major in nursing and psychology, he works as a volunteer with URI's Emergency Medical Services (EMS), a tour guide and orientation leader, and a substitute teacher in Westerly, Rhode Island, on school breaks. He thrives on his busy schedule.

“I chose URI because of the community here. It was the exact size I was looking for and offers a wide range of support services. I appreciated the multitude of opportunities to get involved through clubs and organizations, and specifically URI EMS,” said Fatorma. He had 20 other nursing programs on his list, but the scholarship he received from URI was the deciding factor.

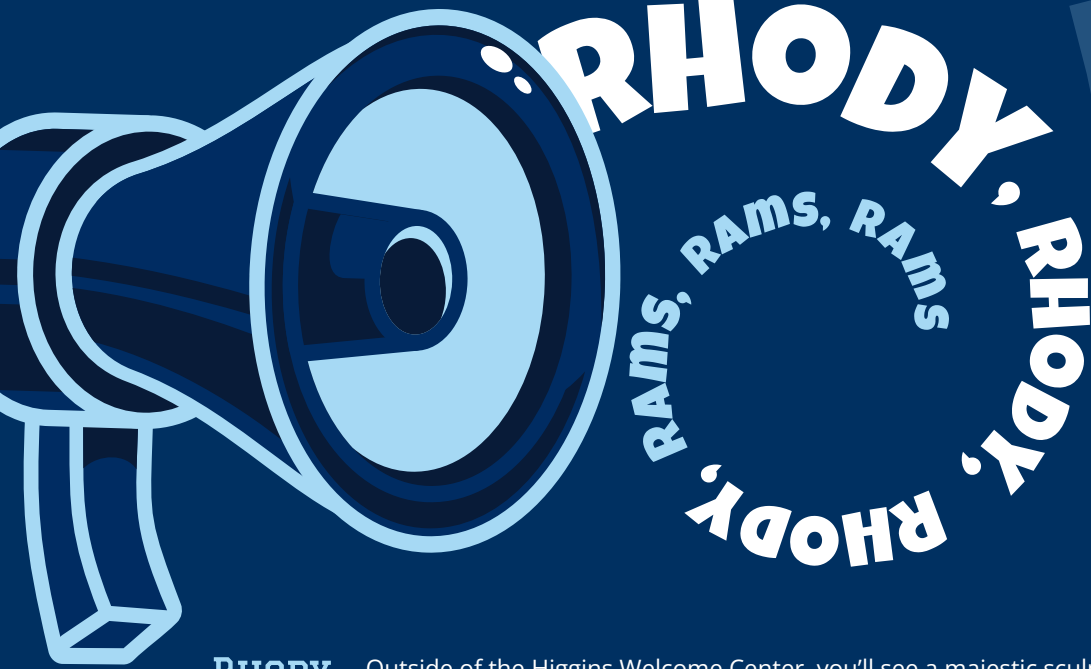

HOMECOMING

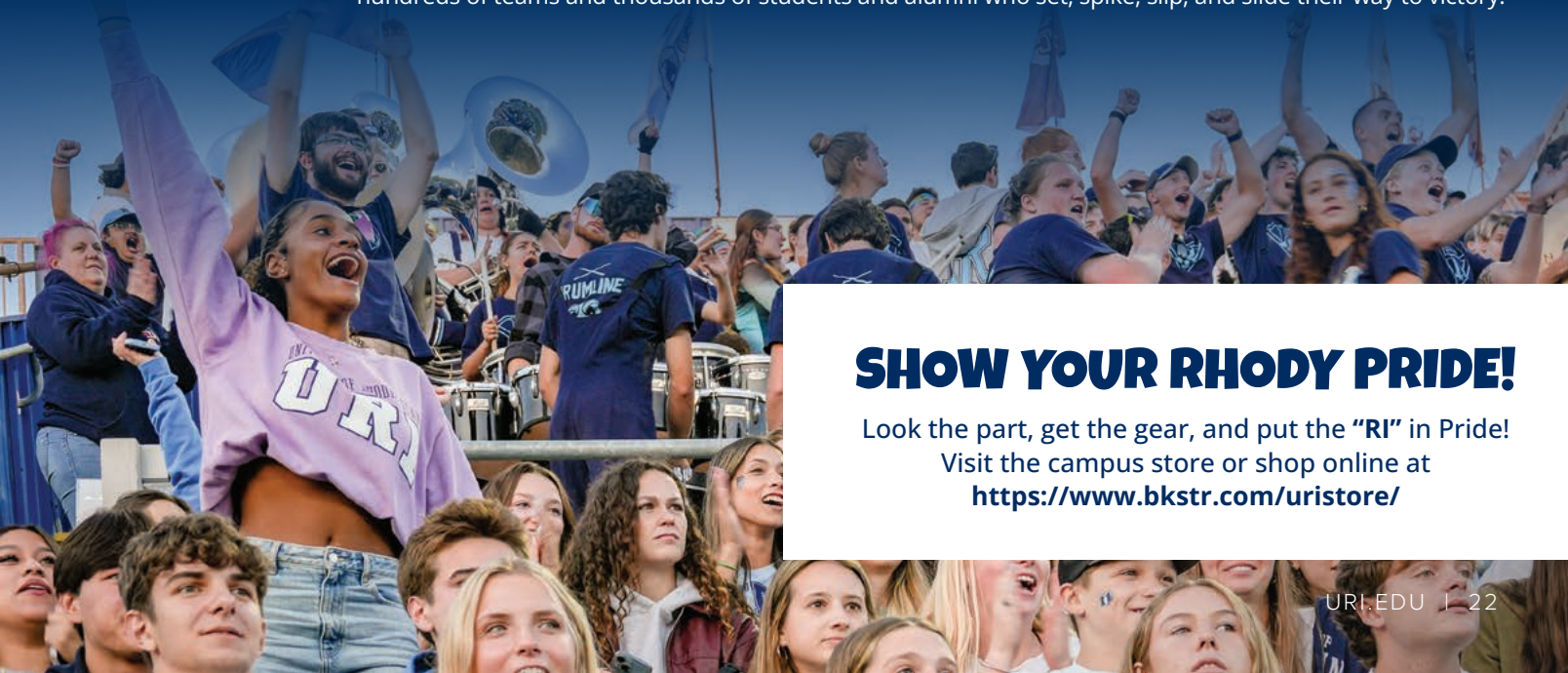

OOZEBALL

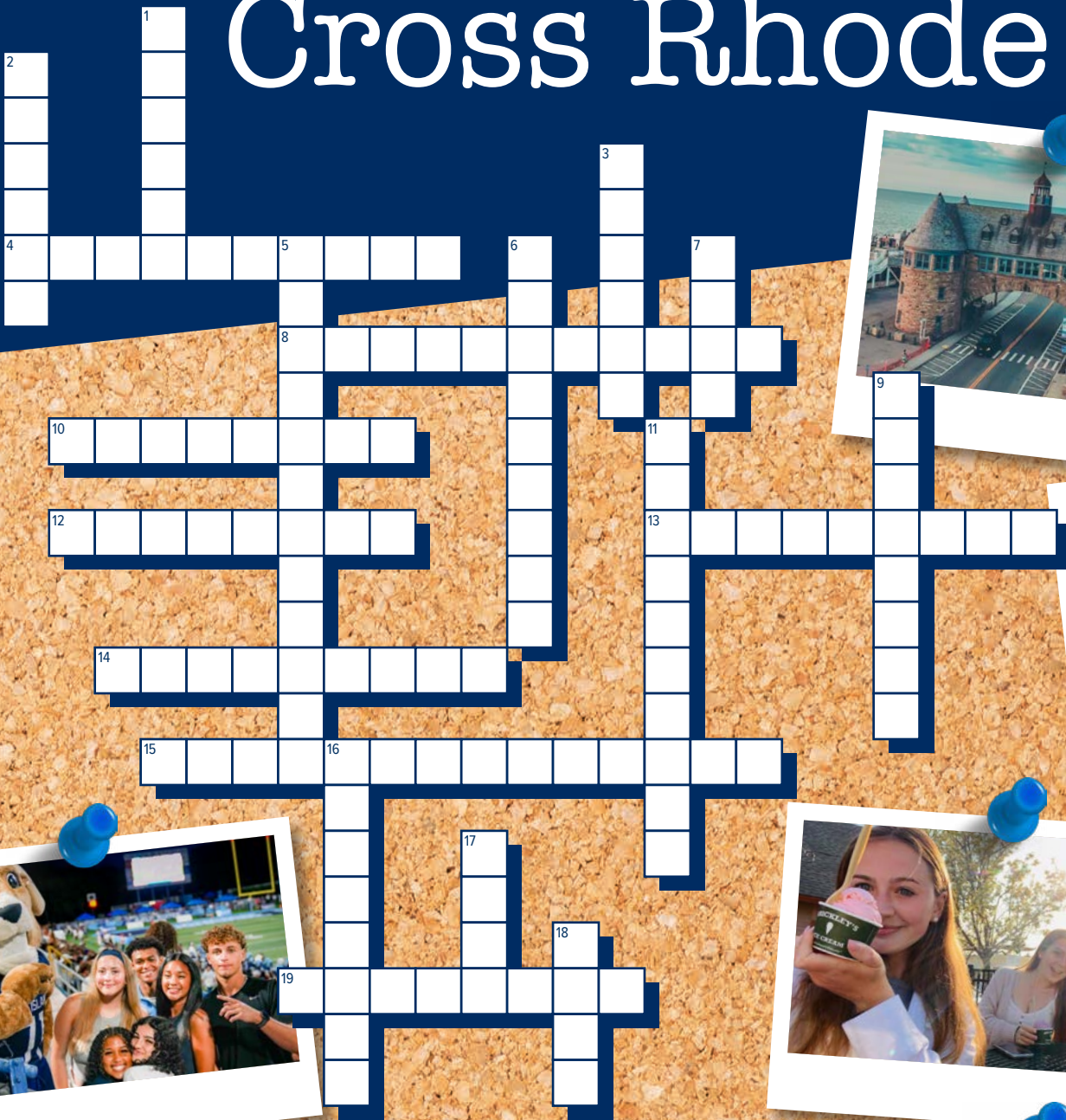
